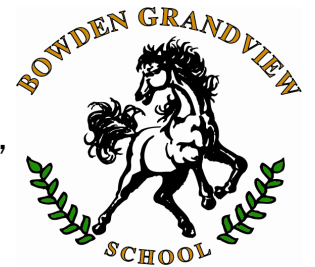

In last week's newsletter we learned a little bit about Governor General's Literary Award-winning painter Allen Sapp. Allen Sapp was a Canadian Cree painter, who resided in North Battleford, Saskatchewan. His art and his story have become well known throughout Canada. His paintings tell a personal story, and many feature images of his grandmother.



The paintings of Allen Sapp reveal what a reservation means to those for whom it is home. Like Remington and Russell in the United States before him, Sapp is a historical chronicler of a life and society that will pass into history, recorded with the sensitivity of one who was part of it. With honesty and without embellishment the artist depicts a bleak environment in a harsh climate without trace of bitterness or protest. "

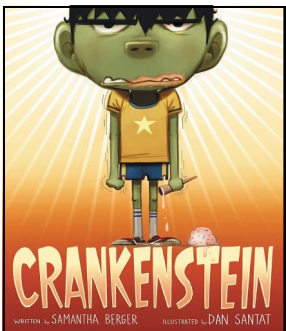

COVID-19 ALBERTA HEALTH DAILY CHECKLIST

PARENTS/GUARDIANS/STUDENTS MUST USE THIS QUESTIONNAIRE DAILY TO DECIDE IF THE STUDENT SHOULD ATTEND SCHOOL

The tool is meant to be used to assist with assessing attendees who may be symptomatic, or who may have been exposed to someone who is ill or has confirmed COVID-19.

Attendees should fill out this checklist prior entering school daily. If an individual answers YES to any of the questions, they must not be allowed to attend school. Children and youth will need a parent to assist them to complete this screening tool.

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to evolve, this screening tool will be updated as required.
