We are happy to honour our school division's commitment to ensuring we continue the work of reconciliation in a meaningful way, by installing Treaty and Métis flags inside our school. Chinook's Edge trustees, central office leaders, and school-based administrators welcomed Elders from Treaty 6 and Treaty 7, along with a Knowledge Keeper from the Métis Nation, to perform a formal blessing of the Treaty and Métis flags in early spring. On Tuesday, May 30th, staff, students and guests gathered to celebrate these gifts to our school. The celebration began with the reading of our land acknowledgement by Lisa Arnesen-Davidson and opening comments by Mr. Thompson and Ms. Northrup. Akina, a Cree singer from Calgary, Alberta performed the national anthem in Cree, spoke about her background and heritage and sang additional songs for the celebration. Akina began her singing career at 13, when she sang 'O Canada' in Cree for a Calgary Flames game on Hockey Night in Canada. She was the first person to sing our national anthem in a language other than French and English. Akina became the youngest person to receive an Aboriginal Role Model Award for music, and she recorded a CD for Alberta Education in Cree as part of their Social Studies Curriculum. The celebration continued by the explanation of treaty's and the importance of flags. In closing, Mrs. Lentz and the elementary choir sang "Music Alive" by Sherryl Sewepagaham.


# Bowden Grandview School Council 2022-2023


# **Literacy Corner**


