


Biology 20 and Marine Biology Field Trip to Bow Habitat Station and Sam Livingston Hatchery (Calgary)




Grade 5 class made the human digestive system out of food items. This helped students understand the anatomy and remember key parts. Great work grade 5's!






Literacy Corner



Sharing Our World: Animals of the Native Northwest is a 28-page board book from Native Northwest publishers. This unique title offers young children an introduction to the various animals from the Pacific Northwest Coast. Each artist's contribution is recognized in this important title for young children. It also introduces young children to Northwest Coast art designs while explaining the importance of interdependence with the environment.

You Are Sacred by Tourond, Sarah-Anne

A lyrical story that encourages the spiritual wellness of young learners. Each page is a reminder that we are all relations and can find solace in the plants and animals, land and sky, and Ancestors around us. Using the teachings of the Spiritual quadrant of the Anishinaabe Medicine Wheel, this affirmational picture book shares a heartwarming message for children: You are Sacred.



Indigenous Education / Literature

On Thursday, September 26th, Bowden Grandview will be participating in Orange Shirt Day. We are excited to welcome Cree "knowledge-keeper" Clare Butterfly. Since 2020, the freelance teacher has mostly brought teachings to schools in the Chinook's Edge School division and some in the Red Deer public district. He's filled in during outdoor education, science, social studies, and even foods classes — and adapted his lessons to the subject at hand. Most of his classes unfold outdoors, where students are led on "medicine walks" through nature.

Butterfly, who has been teaching in the region since obtaining his education degree, admitted he's sometimes wondered whether enough plant species will turn up to keep students interested. But he usually finds the group gets no further than 20 paces before the flow of questions takes them right to the end of class.

For instance, Butterfly might talk about how the pain-relief qualities of aspirin can be found by sucking on the inside of red willow tree bark (although this is something he can't do himself because of allergies.) He regularly warns students not to tamper with plants they don't know very well, since a highly poisonous variety can look very similar to one used to treat bee stings.


He credits the Truth and Reconciliation process for making schools more receptive to the value of these traditional lessons.

Indigenous history is Canadian history, stressed Butterfly. "There has been a loss of identification by not knowing these things... It's unfortunate."

He realized during his own schooling that the knowledge that often sticks with people the longest is what is learned outside of textbooks.

Navigating Technology with our Youth

In this 1.5 hour presentation, we will discuss the role of technology and today's youth. The message of this presentation is not only based on technology, but also about a child's healthy brain development and the necessary parenting/caregiver role in creating healthy, emotional, regulated, and integrated brains. This presentation will address the underpinning of a child's emotional brain development and how to grow it, as well as how technology can dangerously hijack this.

We believe that talking does not grow neurons; experience grows neurons. This workshop is designed to give attendees the skills to become their child's emotional coach. The workshop will provide participants with:

- An understanding of the basic neuroscience behind healthy brain development,
- The dangers of technology for healthy brain development,
- Technology use rules that will help your child
- · When building healthy brains, how to identify emotions in your child/student, and

 How to become your child's/student's emotional coach in only five steps and in that, build a resilient child.

The presentation is facilitated by a therapist from Juno House who has years of both clinical and facilitating experience. Juno House was founded in 2008 as a Centre of Excellence for adolescent girls and young women who are experiencing anxiety-based mental health issues of self-harm, obsessive compulsive disorders, depression and eating disorders.


