#### Parent Student Teacher Interviews: November 5 and November 6, 2024

Parent Student Teacher Interviews are scheduled for November 5 and 6, 2024 from 3:30 pm to 6:30 pm.

We are excited to have the opportunity to discuss your children here at the school on these evenings. Those parents and guardians who are unable to make these dates work are encouraged to contact their children's teachers to make other arrangements such as Google Meet or phone call.

Parents, with students in grade 5 through 12, as always, have instant access to all marks and comments in PowerSchool and are encouraged to check their parent access portals regularly to stay up to date. If you need help accessing the PowerSchool system please contact our office. It is anticipated that CESD will be moving K to 4 student marks to PowerSchool within the next year or so.

The booking system will open for bookings this Monday, October 21 at 9:00 am. \*It is very user friendly!

Bookings will close Monday, November 4 at 8:00 am.

\*Please note this is for grades 1 to 12 only. The Kindergarten teacher will contact you directly to book for your Kinder student.

#### Instructions for using our online booking system:

On Monday, October 21 at 9:00 am, you can visit our website at: www.bowdengrandview.ca.

Click on "Bookings" at the top of the page.

Click on the event called "Grade 1-12: Nov 5 and 6 PT Interviews".

On the first screen, you will be asked to enter your name (Parent), your phone number and email address.

In-Person will be the only preference you can choose. At the bottom of the first screen you will be asked to add your students.

Click Next. On the second screen, you will then be asked to choose which class and teacher for each child. Under Class, the default is "Bowden Grandview Teachers". Please select this as the default.

Then Click on teachers and it will list each teacher in our school. You will add one teacher at a time. You may have to scroll down to find a name.

Once you have selected your child's teachers, the next screen will allow you to pick what time you would like to book provided that time is available. A circle indicates that it is available. A dash indicates it is not available. The booking system only allows you to choose one time slot per teacher. Use the bar at the bottom to scroll to the right for later times.

Once you have completed your bookings, a confirmation screen will appear and a confirmation email will be sent to you. It will have a link you can click if you need to view, change or cancel a booking.



Halloween is just around the corner and what better way to start preparing but by sharing some spooktacular reads this spooky season!




#### Lila and the Jack-o'-Lantern by Nancy Churnin

#### Words That Encourage Emotional Expression

- How are you feeling?

- It's okay to be sad. We're all sad sometimes.
- 4. What does your heart say?
- Nothing you can do or say will make me love you less.

#### Words That Build Connection and Trust

- Your smile brightens my day.
- We're so grateful to have you in our family.
- You filled my bucket today.
- 4. I'm thinking about you.
- I'll support you no matter what.

## Words That Inspire Confidence and Resillence

- 1. Your best effort is enough.
- 2. You spread kindness everywhere!
- You can do anything you dream of.
- 4. I believe in you.
- 5. I see you, I hear you, you matter.
- Just be you. That's enough.


