

NATIONAL WINNIE THE POOH DAY - January 18



National Winnie the Pooh Day on January 18th commemorates author A.A. Milne's birthday in 1882. He brought the adorable, honey-loving bear to life in his stories, which also featured his son, Christopher Robin.

Alan Alexander Milne (18 January 1882 – 31 January 1956) was an English writer best known for his books about the <u>teddy bear Winnie-the-Pooh</u>, as well as for children's poetry. Milne was primarily a playwright before the huge success of Winnie-the-Pooh overshadowed all his previous work. He served in both world wars, as a lieutenant in the <u>Royal Warwickshire Regiment</u> in the <u>First World War</u> and as a <u>captain</u> in the <u>Home Guard</u> in the Second World War.

Q. Was Christopher Robin a real boy?


A. Author A.A. Milne created the character Christopher Robin after his own son Christopher Robin Milne.

A. A.A. Milne wrote four books for the series. They are:

- When We Were Very Young (1924)
- Winnie-the-Pooh (1926)
- Now We Are Six (1927)
- The House At Pooh Corner (1928)


Q. When did Tigger first appear in the Winnie the Pooh books?A. Tigger is the last main character introduced in the Winnie the Pooh series. He first appears in The House At Pooh Corner in 1928.

The snowy owl, which can be found as far north as the Arctic Circle, is one of North America's biggest owls at approximately half a metre tall and with a wingspan of about a metre and a half. The powerful birds are keen hunters and have few natural predators.
